Per discussion at the previous meeting and per the Mayor's direction, we have estimated a cost of \$4500 to perform a property survey on the east side of Valentine Dr., according to the rough exhibit attached hereto. The impacted lots will be #108-124 (only the even number addressed lots on the east side of the road), representing a length of roughly 605 feet. There is a 20' drainage easement platted on those lots which will also be staked out by the surveyor to allow easy identification of the allowable work area.

Once the survey is completed, we will work with the Building Office to identify the trees located in or near the drainage easement. It would be our recommendation with the Mayor to remove all nuisance & invasive tree species within the City's drainage easement. Where possible, any other trees will be protected from damage, meaning the drainage improvements will be designed to minimize those impacts.

Overstreet & Associates is currently working on preparing an ADA Transition Plan in accordance with the ADA Title II requirements, but it has not yet been finalized. The ADA Transition Plan includes:

- 1. Self-evaluation of the existing sidewalk facilities to identify barriers/obstructions,
- 2. Description of methods to bring sidewalks into compliance
- 3. Estimated costs and schedules to make sidewalks compliant, &
- 4. Identification of the public official responsible for implementation of the ADA Transition Plan.

Specifically, this Letter will be addressing the need and requirements related to identifying the public official responsible for implementation of the ADA Transition Plan.

The roles of an ADA Coordinator are:

- Provide a contact for members of the Public to assist Ihem with ADA concerns and/or compliance. This includes receiving ADA Complaint/Grievance Form. This form serves as way for member of the Public to notify the City of concerns, allow the City to evaluate the issue, and provide the required corrective action. Attached is a draft of a ADA Complaint/Grievance Form.
- 2. Provide the City with a single source to monitor and address ADA issues
- 3. Provide an individual responsible for maintaining and updating the City's ADA Transition Plan

The ADA Coordinator shall be a City employee and should be familiar with the ADA requirements and effectively deal with local government, advocacy groups & the Public. Due to the scope of the ADA requirements, some governments have chosen to create a Board that includes an ADA

Coordinator to assist when issues arise. The Board (whether formally instituted or would typically consists of representatives from the following City Departments:

- Public Works Public Works can perform minor repairs such as replacement of ADA signs, warning surfaces and other small repairs
- Engineering Engineering can provide guidance on the latest ADA design standards
- Legal Legal can provide guidance on the law
- Building/Planning Department Building Department usually is the person who receives
  plans of proposed developments and coordinates with others to determine if
  developments are being proposed in accordance with City ordinances.
- Legislative Legislative representative can assist in communicating issues to the Public or can be a person that is responsible for preparing and coordinating with grant agencies.

In conclusion, the information provided in this letter is meant to serve as a starting point to determine the person(s) that will be in charge of implementing the ADA Transition Plan. After the City has determined the responsible official(s), the process of implementing and maintaining the ADA Transition Plan can be determined. The final details of the ADA Transition Plan are still being completed.

# AGREEMENT BETWEEN OWNER AND CONTRACTOR FOR CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT (STIPULATED PRICE)

This Agreement is by and between City of Long Beach, MS ("Owner") and W.C. Fore Trucking, Inc. ("Contractor").

Terms used in this Agreement have the meanings stated in the General Conditions and the Supplementary Conditions.

Owner and Contractor hereby agree as follows:

### ARTICLE 1-WORK

1.01 Contractor shall complete all Work as specified or indicated in the Contract Documents. The Work is generally described as follows: Construction of approximately 700 LF of concrete sheet pile bulkhead, concrete piles and pile cap, and site work consisting of the installation of drainage, sldewalk, curb and gutter, parking lot repair, and associated work.

### ARTICLE 2—THE PROJECT

2.01 The Project, of which the Work under the Contract Documents is a part, is generally described as follows: Long Beach Harbor – Inner Bulkhead

### ARTICLE 3—ENGINEER

- 3.01 The Owner has retained Overstreet & Associates, PLLC ("Engineer") to act as Owner's representative, assume all duties and responsibilities of Engineer, and have the rights and authority assigned to Engineer in the Contract.
- 3.02 The part of the Project that pertains to the Work has been designed by Overstreet & Associates, PLLC ("Engineer").

### **ARTICLE 4—CONTRACT TIMES**

- 4.01 Time is of the Essence
  - A. All time limits for Milestones, if any, Substantial Completion, and completion and readiness for final payment as stated in the Contract Documents are of the essence of the Contract.
- 4.02 Contract Times; Dates
  - A. The Work will be substantially complete on or before the date established by the Notice to Proceed, and completed and ready for final payment in accordance with Paragraph 15.06 of the General Conditions.
- 4.03 Contract Times: Days
  - A. The Work will be completed and ready for final payment in accordance with Paragraph 15.06 of the General Conditions within 510 days after the date when the Contract Time commences to run.

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### 4.05 Liquidated Damages

- A. Contractor and Owner recognize that time is of the essence as stated in Paragraph 4.01 above and that Owner will suffer financial and other losses if the Work is not completed and Milestones not achieved within the Contract Times, as duly modified. The parties also recognize the delays, expense, and difficulties involved in proving, in a legal or arbitration proceeding, the actual loss suffered by Owner if the Work is not completed on time. Accordingly, instead of requiring any such proof, Owner and Contractor agree that as liquidated damages for delay (but not as a penalty):
  - Substantial Completion: Contractor shall pay Owner \$500.00 for each day that expires
    after the time (as duly adjusted pursuant to the Contract) specified above for Substantial
    Completion, until the Work is substantially complete.
  - Completion of Remaining Work: After Substantial Completion, if Contractor shall neglect, refuse, or fail to complete the remaining Work within the Contract Times (as duly adjusted pursuant to the Contract) for completion and readiness for final payment, Contractor shall pay Owner \$500.00 for each day that expires after such time until the Work is completed and ready for final payment.
- B. If Owner recovers liquidated damages for a delay in completion by Contractor, then such liquidated damages are Owner's sole and exclusive remedy for such delay, and Owner is precluded from recovering any other damages, whether actual, direct, excess, or consequential, for such delay, except for special damages (if any) specified in this Agreement.

### 4.06 Special Damages

- A. Contractor shall reimburse Owner (1) for any fines or penalties imposed on Owner as a direct result of the Contractor's failure to attain Substantial Completion according to the Contract Times, and (2) for the actual costs reasonably incurred by Owner for engineering, construction observation, Inspection, and administrative services needed after the time specified in Paragraph 4.02 for Substantial Completion (as duly adjusted pursuant to the Contract), until the Work is substantially complete.
- B. After Contractor achieves Substantial Completion, if Contractor shall neglect, refuse, or fall to complete the remaining Work within the Contract Times, Contractor shall reimburse Owner for the actual costs reasonably incurred by Owner for engineering, construction observation, inspection, and administrative services needed after the time specified in Paragraph 4.02 for Work to be completed and ready for final payment (as duly adjusted pursuant to the Contract), until the Work is completed and ready for final payment.
- C. The special damages imposed in this paragraph are supplemental to any liquidated damages for delayed completion established in this Agreement.

### ARTICLE 5—CONTRACT PRICE

- 5.01 Owner shall pay Contractor for completion of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents, the amounts that follow, subject to adjustment under the Contract:
  - A. For all Unit Price Work, an amount equal to the sum of the extended prices (established for each separately identified item of Unit Price Work by multiplying the unit price times the actual quantity of that item) at the prices stated in Contractor's Bid.

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### **ARTICLE 6—PAYMENT PROCEDURES**

### 6.01 Submittal and Processing of Payments

A. Contractor shall submit Applications for Payment in accordance with Article 15 of the General Conditions. Applications for Payment will be processed by Engineer as provided in the General Conditions. Progress payments will be based upon the amount of work installed and acceptable to the Engineer.

### 6.02 Progress Payments; Retainage

A. Five percent (5%) of the total of each monthly estimate shall be retained until the work is at least fifty percent (50%) complete, on schedule and satisfactory in the Engineer's opinion, at which time fifty percent (50%) of the retainage held to date shall be returned to the prime contractor for distribution to the appropriate subcontractors and suppliers. Provided, however, that future retainage shall be withheld at the rate of two and one-half percent (2 ½%). Subsequent to Substantial Completion of all work, acceptable to the Engineer, Engineer will have the option to reduce the held retainage until project close-out.

### 6.03 Final Payment

A. Upon final completion and acceptance of the Work and receipt of all documents necessary to close out the project, the Owner shall pay the Contractor the remainder of the Contract Price for installed work and any held retainage in accordance with Paragraph 15.06 of the General Conditions.

### 6.04 Consent of Surety

A. Owner will not make final payment, or return or release retainage unless Contractor submits written consent of the surety to such payment, return, or release.

### **ARTICLE 7—CONTRACT DOCUMENTS**

### 7.01 Contents

- A. The Contract Documents consist of all of the following:
  - 1. This Agreement.
  - 2. Bonds:
    - a. Performance bond (together with power of attorney).
    - b. Payment bond (together with power of attorney).
  - 3. General Conditions (not attached but incorporated by reference).
  - 4. Supplementary Conditions (not attached but incorporated by reference).
  - General & Technical Specifications as listed in the table of contents of the project manual (not attached but incorporated by reference).
  - Drawings (not attached but incorporated by reference) consisting of 31 sheets with each sheet bearing the following general title: Long Beach Harbor Inner Bulkhead.
  - Addenda (numbers 1 to 8, inclusive and Clarification 9) (not attached but Incorporated by reference).

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- 9. Exhibits to this Agreement (enumerated as follows):
  - a. Contractor's Bid (pages 1 to 18, inclusive) (not attached but incorporated by reference).
- 10. The following which may be delivered or issued on or after the Effective Date of the Contract and are not attached hereto:
  - a. Notice to Proceed.
  - b. Work Change Directives.
  - c. Change Orders.
  - d. Field Orders.
  - e. Warranty Bond, If any.
- B. The Contract Documents may only be amended, modified, or supplemented as provided in the Contract.

### ARTICLE 8—REPRESENTATIONS, CERTIFICATIONS, AND STIPULATIONS

### 8.01 Contractor's Representations

- A. In order to Induce Owner to enter into this Contract, Contractor makes the following representations:
  - Contractor has examined and carefully studied the Contract Documents, including Addenda.
  - Contractor has visited the Site, conducted a thorough visual examination of the Site and adjacent areas, and become familiar with the general, local, and Site conditions that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
  - Contractor is familiar with all Laws and Regulations that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
  - 4. Contractor has carefully studied the reports of explorations and tests of subsurface conditions at or adjacent to the Site and the drawlings of physical conditions relating to existing surface or subsurface structures at the Site that have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions, with respect to the Technical Data in such reports and drawlings.
  - 5. Contractor has considered the information known to Contractor itself; information commonly known to contractors doing business in the locality of the Site; information and observations obtained from visits to the Site; the Contract Documents; and the Technical Data identified in the Supplementary Conditions or by definition, with respect to the effect of such information, observations, and Technical Data on (a) the cost, progress, and performance of the Work; (b) the means, methods, techniques, sequences, and procedures of construction to be employed by Contractor; and (c) Contractor's safety precautions and programs.
  - Based on the information and observations referred to in the preceding paragraph,
     Contractor agrees that no further examinations, investigations, explorations, tests,
     studies, or data are necessary for the performance of the Work at the Contract Price,

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within the Contract Times, and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Contract.

- Contractor is aware of the general nature of work to be performed by Owner and others at the Site that relates to the Work as indicated in the Contract Documents.
- 8. Contractor has given Engineer written notice of all conflicts, errors, ambiguities, or discrepancies that Contractor has discovered in the Contract Documents, and of discrepancies between Site conditions and the Contract Documents, and the written resolution thereof by Engineer is acceptable to Contractor.
- The Contract Documents are generally sufficient to indicate and convey understanding of all terms and conditions for performance and furnishing of the Work.
- 10. Contractor's entry into this Contract constitutes an incontrovertible representation by Contractor that without exception all prices in the Agreement are premised upon performing and furnishing the Work required by the Contract Documents.

### 8.02 Contractor's Certifications

- A. Contractor certifies that it has not engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, or coercive practices in competing for or in executing the Contract. For the purposes of this Paragraph 8.02:
  - "corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of anything of value likely to Influence the action of a public official in the bidding process or in the Contract execution:
  - "fraudulent practice" means an intentional misrepresentation of facts made (a) to
    influence the bidding process or the execution of the Contract to the detriment of Owner,
    (b) to establish Bid or Contract prices at artificial non-competitive levels, or (c) to deprive
    Owner of the benefits of free and open competition;
  - "collusive practice" means a scheme or arrangement between two or more Bidders, with or without the knowledge of Owner, a purpose of which is to establish Bid prices at artificial, non-competitive levels; and
  - "coercive practice" means harming or threatening to harm, directly or indirectly, persons or their property to influence their participation in the bidding process or affect the execution of the Contract.

Ladies and Gentlemen:

At previous meetings, the Board has requested that we compile the list of roads that should be considered for funding in the referenced budget/paving plan. The attached sheet includes such a list of roads, gathered from three sources:

1. Direction provided by Aldermen & the Mayor.

- Direction provided by Public Works regarding roads which are in poor condition, likely due to the history of repairs on the roads.
- 3. Direction obtained from the SMPDD Road Planning tool to which the City subscribes.

The list contains each road which has been thus identified and includes the SMPDD tool Road Surface Rating ("RSR") for each. The RSR is an estimate of the current condition/life cycle position of the asphalt road. Lower numbers indicate roads which are nearer the end of their useful life.

We are working on estimating the cost to perform the paving work on these roads but haven't completed that yet. If directed, we can estimate the cost of each of the attached roads. However, it takes some significant effort to estimate the costs, and it would be beneficial to more fully understand the City's desires and the estimated budget to pave to make our estimation process more efficient.

Please consider the attached list and advise:

1. If any roads should be added or removed from the list.

- If we should estimate paving costs up to a certain budget threshold or if we should provide estimates for the entire list.
- 3. If the City desires any particular priority for road selections.

We are ready to provide any further information necessary to facilitate your decisions in this matter. Please advise on how we should proceed.
